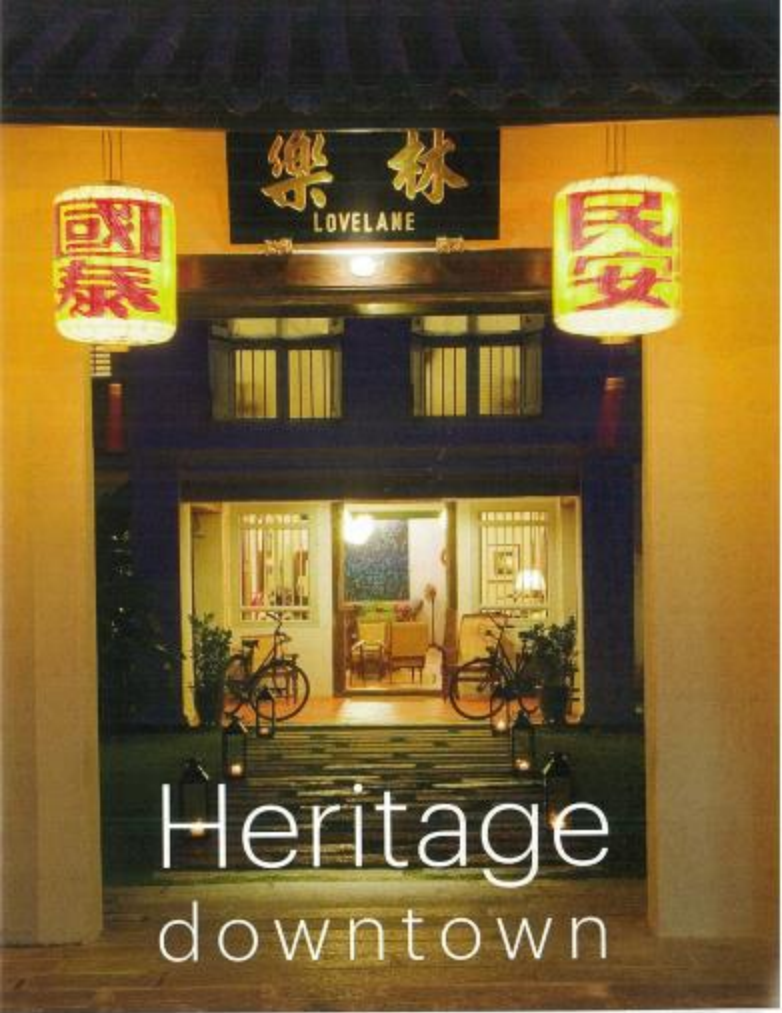

dishes – stuffed crab with cheese, tiger prawns, deep-fried salt and pepper mantis prawns and chilli crab.

23LOVELANE

Set within a walled courtyard in the Unesco World Heritage Site of George Town, 23LoveLane is a boutique heritage hotel that exudes a relaxed charm. The hotel is housed in a carefully restored property that dates back to the 1800s, and there's a stylish mix of antique furniture and contemporary artworks dotted around the space.

Accommodation at 23LoveLane chiefly consists of four wings – the Anglo Indian Bungalow, the Straits Eclectic Building, the 1920's Jack Annex and the Indian Shop House. There are also additional suites – Muntri Suites and the Stewart Suite – that are situated in pre-war shophouses within walking distance of the main building.

All the rooms are outfitted with modern amenities (yes, WiFi is available) and are delightfully decorated with plenty of space and tranquil views of the garden. There's also a small library



and common area upstairs in the main building for guests to hang out and relax. Should hunger strike, dine at *SteakFrites@23*. It's located in a charming pre-



war shophouse right next door and serves what are arguably the finest steaks in town. And if you fancy a nightcap, head to the lobby bar where you'll find tropical cocktails and bar snacks.

The hotel lies a mere stone's throw away from various attractions in town, so it's ideally situated if you want to spend the day sightseeing. A tasteful mix of the old and new, 23Love Lane is a gorgeous hotel that's definitely worth the slightly upscale price.

Malls

Gurney Paragon

Persiaran Gurney (+604 228 8266/gurneyparagon.com).

Gurney Paragon is a nine-storey premiere shopping mall housing international labels such as Debenhams, Michael Kors, Victoria's Secret and Harvey Norman. The food court has a good selection of stalls and there are a host of other eateries to cater to every food craving.

Gurney Plaza

This is yet another gargantuan mall with high street labels, a

well-stocked supermarket, cineplex, bustling food stalls and restaurants, and even a karaoke joint should you wish to test your pop star potential.

Queensbay Mall

This five-storey mall is located just a short distance away from the Penang Bridge. There's a comprehensive selection of brands both local and international that ranges from fashion and sports to lifestyle and entertainment. If tummies start growling, there's no shortage of dining choices as well.

Markets

Air Itam Market

Jalan Pagar, Air Itam.

The number of fruit and vegetable vendors at Air Itam Market has grown significantly in recent years.

Shop here for fresh spices, street food, apparel and Chinese medicine. This market is also home to several popular Penang assam (lebu) vendors and the celebrated Sisters' Curry Mee.
Daily, 7am onwards.

Batu Ferringhi Night Market

Jalan Batu Ferringhi, Batu Ferringhi.

Be prepared to haggle at this night market where most goods are sold at 'tourist prices'. This is kitsch at its worst (or best depending how you look at it). It warrants a quick stroll through but no more than that.
Daily, 5pm-late.

Chowrasta Bazaar

Jalan Penang, George Town.

In operation since 1963, Chowrasta Bazaar has been tempting locals and travellers with its traditional goods, local snacks and street eats. Head to the second floor where stacks of secondhand and comic books are arranged in ceiling-high piles.
Daily, 8.30am-10pm.

Little Penang Street Market

Upper Penang Road, George Town (+6012 475 9079/lyb.com/littlepenangcommunity).

This monthly market serves as a platform for locals who want to sell their arts and crafts, books, clothing and jewellery. It's a fun way to spend the weekend afternoon.
Last Saturday and Sunday of every month, 10am-4pm.

Lorong Kulit Flea Market

Jalan Dato Kerawai, George Town

This market was once known as 'Thieves' Market' since much of the wares were 'illegally procured' and its bad reputation preceded it. Today, the market is less dodgy but also less exciting with eclectic antiques replaced by cheap imitac knacks.
Daily, 6am-1pm.

Occupy Beach Street

Lebuh Pantai, George Town (+6017 420 7942/lyb.com/occupybeachstreet/).

Endorsed by the Penang State Government, this family-friendly market is a riot of colours and sounds. Look out for the drummer who bangs out tunes on old Milo tin cans.
Every Sunday, 7am-1pm.

23 Love Lane

23 Love Lane, George Town (+604 262 1323/23lovelane.com). Formerly a private family residence, this boutique hotel is best described as a labour of love, from the detailed renovation works undertaken to restore the original buildings' architecture to the inclusion of the owner's personal collection of Southeast Asian art and antiques. We like the brightly decorated library, which is the ideal place to relax after a day of exploring.

Eastern & Oriental Hotel

10 Lebuh Fargubar, George Town (+604 222 2000/eohotel.com).

The Sarkies brothers were hoteliers who knew that luxury accommodation was necessary in the major entrepôts of Asia. Their first property was the E&O in Penang followed by The Raffles in Singapore and The Strand in Rangoon. Rooms here hark back to an opulent British past but are enhanced with every conceivable mod con.

The Edison

15 Lebuh Lotit, George Town (+604 262 2993/theedisonhotel.com).

Now a luxury hotel, the building has gone through several drastic changes from being a tycoon's private estate to a brothel and opium den, and even a dance hall. It's now The Edison with tastefully decorated rooms, Appelles Apothecary & Lab, toiletries, and complimentary nougat and orange-infused water delivered to the rooms. Hand-woven bags are placed in each room for guests' use – an eco-friendly initiative to eliminate the use of plastic bags, which is another plus point of this hotel.
